

# Expanding Asynchronous Library Instruction Support 2024 Project Report

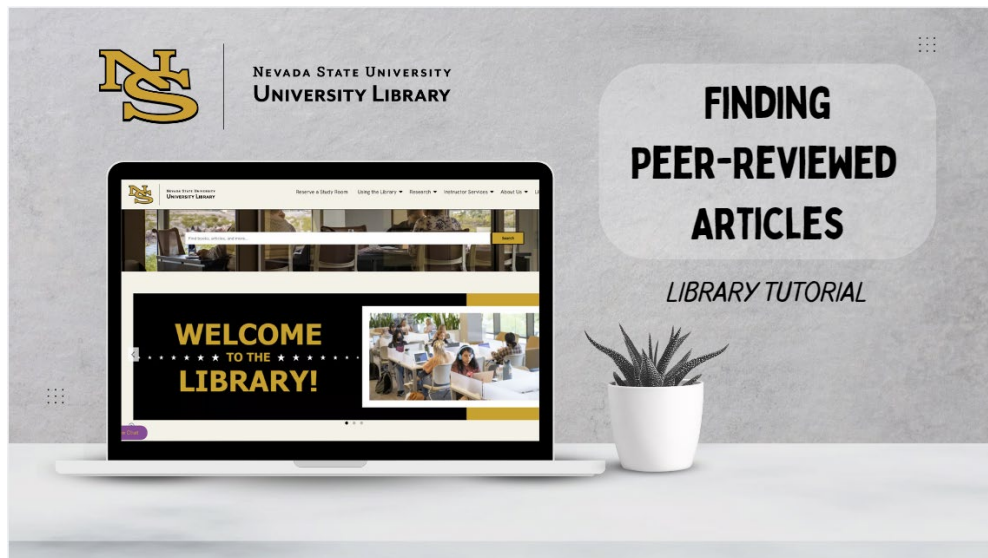
## Summary

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The University Library created 2 library video tutorials designed to help students navigate library resources effectively. The first video focused on giving students an introduction to research using University Library resources, while the second video provided guidance on locating peer-reviewed articles. Both tutorials aimed to enhance students' information literacy skills.
